
GREAT THANKSGIVING

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


Therefore, gracious Father, with this bread and cup we remember... ...the great and promised feast.

Introduction to the Day

Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well, knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come.

Today

This morning we enter the portion of the church year in which we contemplate "end-times." The natural cycle of seasons and the final portion of the Church Year direct our reflections toward transformations and transitions, the endings and beginnings in our own lives.



On this, the first Sunday in November we observe the *Feast of All Saints*. We give thanks for the men and women who have gone before us in Christ and look to their lives of faith as models for our own. We remember those near and dear to us, who, by patient example and encouragement, shaped and nurtured our own faith. In the prayers we

remember them by name and give thanks that their names are written in the book of heaven.

Call Committee Members Needed

Saint Luke continues to be engaged in the work of calling a new pastor. A Call Committee is being newly formed as part of this process. We invite all members of Saint Luke to consider volunteering to serve as a member on the 2025 Call Committee.

After receiving guidance from the Metropolitan Chicago Synod (the Synod) representative, the Call Committee will organize itself, edit the existing Ministry Site Profile (as needed), and elect a Chairperson or Co-Chairpersons. The Call Committee will receive a slate of candidates recommended by the Synod. Then, following the Synod's guidelines, the Call Committee will conduct a series of interviews of this slate of candidates. They will evaluate and recommend the candidate it believes God desires this congregation to have as its pastor. That candidate would be able to accept or decline the offer of a call. Additional slates of candidates would be considered, as required.

Serving on the Call Committee will require a significant time commitment, both for meetings and prayerful discernment. If you would like to serve on the Call Committee, please complete the form below by November 24, 2024. You will be contacted by the Nominating Committee for an interview to complete this process. The Nominating Committee will present a complete Call Committee slate to the Ministry Board for ratification. The Call Committee members' names are expected to be announced in January 2025.

Positions on the call committee are limited, and we will strive to create a committee that represents the entire congregation. We greatly appreciate the desire to serve expressed by all applicants.
