



Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

God proclaiming in his thunder Jesus as his Son by name!







Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.



Forgive us our sins



All baptized Christians are welcome at the Lord's table. At the invitation of an usher, please proceed to communion at the front of the church by the center aisle and return via the side aisles.



Today: The Transfiguration of Our Lord

On this Sunday, the last Sunday before the beginning of Lent, we observe the Transfiguration of Our Lord. The altar is adorned in white to mark the solemnity and mystery of the divine presence and blessing. The day of the Transfiguration is a turning point in our church calendar. This is the final feast before the fast of Lent. We celebrate Jesus revealed in his divine nature and then turn our attention to his work of salvation in his journey to the cross.
