





# NEWS AND INFORMATION March 23, 2025



## Worship Space

During the season of Lent, changes in the liturgy serve to emphasize the reflective and penitential nature of this season: The *joyful Hymn of Praise "Glory to God in the Highest" is omitted*. Finally, the *Alleluia is absent*. It was "buried" on Shrove Tuesday and will not be sung until the announcement of the resurrection when we again shout that ancient and joyful acclamation.

The colors on the altar and vestments point us toward our journey's end. Violet is the traditional color for penitential seasons, times when we concentrate on amending our lives Purple is the ancient color of royalty. On the altar these two colors are formed into the cross identified with the city of Jerusalem.

A thorn-wrapped purple heartwood cross leads the procession

On the pulpit is a *Tapestry of Remembrance*: a woven net is entwined with symbols of the Passion. This physical symbol prompts recall of the events of the final week of our journey as our Lord makes his way to the cross. What symbols do you see?

The Lenten environment at Saint Luke is a pilgrim's road. With each entry into the sanctuary we re-create our spiritual journey, adjusting our direction to better follow the One whose sacrifice restores our loss.

In the chancel, the space that shined brightly at Christmas is now replaced with a dead tree.

The way of the cross is our focus for this season. The way of the cross is our focus for this season. It is our discipline and our destination. We are going up to Jerusalem to meet death. In the cross, we are confident we will return the victors.

# Introduction to the Day

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!
