Introduction to the Day

All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just the clergy but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to the story of the vision of Jacob, who called the place of his vision "the house of God, and … the gate of heaven" (Genesis 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

The joy of Christmas continues! Environmental features remain from that festive season to remind us that we continue in our joy at the birth of God's Son. The "Light to the Nations" now continues his epiphany through his earthly ministry which we follow in the Gospel readings for this season.


